
Acting Against Anti-Semitism! In Youth Work and Education

Education in Germany – Encounter with Israel



Interdisciplinary Bilateral Expert Group on the Topic "Do Encounters Have an Effect Against Prejudices?"

30-31 May 2022 Berlin



Questioning stereotypes and prejudice about the "Other" stays at the very core of every youth exchange program. Personal encounters create the space in which young people not only build new relationships but also experience a positive view on diversity and are able to develop empathy as well as understanding about differing life realities.

ConAct – German-Israeli Youth Exchange and the **Israel Youth Exchange Authority** wish to further examine the potential of youth encounters and invite you cordially to become a member of an Interdisciplinary Bilateral Group of Experts from Germany and Israel which will exchange insights and experience on the topic "**Do Encounters Have an Effect Against Prejudice?**".

- To what extent can encounters between young people counteract stereotypes and prejudice?
- What are the challenges but also the endless possibilities which encounter programs create in dealing with different world views and life realities?
- What is expected in terms of educational preparation and how can youth encounters reach their potential on an individual level as well as a tool for social change?

The Interdisciplinary Bilateral Expert Group:

- Consists of 18 professionals from Germany and Israel
- Each expert brings expertise from different fields of work such as education, scientific research and
 international youth work, related also to the effects of encounters as a tool against prejudice and
 discrimination.
- The aim of the meeting is to critically think about the effects of encounter projects and discuss its
 limitations but also possibilities. Together we wish to examine the factors from which an encounter
 project can benefit the most, in order to create positive attitudes against prejudice and
 discrimination.
- The exchange between the professionals from both countries will create a valuable pool of insights which will be utilized in the **preparation of a German-Israeli conference** on the topic "Do Encounters Have an Effect Against Prejudice?" The conference will take place in November 2022 in Berlin.

The model project "Acting against Anti-Semitism in Youth Work and Education" was funded in 2020-2021 by the Federal Government Commissioner for Jewish Life in Germany and the Fight against Antisemitism. The Federal Ministry for Family Affairs, Senior Citizens, Women and Youth supports the continuation of the project by providing supplementary funding for further project modules. The project is realized by ConAct — Coordination Center German-Israeli Youth Exchange in cooperation with the Israel Youth Exchange Authority.
