Current Developments – Remaining Challenges – New Materials

The anniversary of the relations between Germany and Israel in the year 2015 marked both new and existing long-lasting linkages for German-Israeli youth contacts. The Federal Ministry for Family Affairs, Senior Citizens, Women and Youth, ConAct and the Israel Youth Exchange Authority have now put a focus on one of those key aspects: Life in open and democratic societies has for decades been an important topic in German-Israeli education and exchange programs and is at the same time in need for new actions and measures.

The project "Living Diversity in Germany and Israel", which is mainly funded by the German federal program "Live Democracy!" aims at developing a German-Israeli educational network of organizations and professionals who wish to actively deepen the consciousness of democratic values in youth work and exchange projects. The project aims to increase the awareness of the existing diversity – such as in cultural, religious and sexual orientation, ethnic and social belonging and physical and mental abilities – in both countries.

Since more than a year, the project "Living Diversity in Germany and Israel – Challenges and Perspectives for Education and Youth Exchange " has been offering a platform to professionals and organizations to exchange and discuss on diversity-conscious educational approaches, reflect upon educational strategies, develop materials for youth exchange and expand their network including new target groups.

As part of a mid-term review of the project it is now important to reflect on the achieved results: Which valuable insights could participants and contributors gain in the discourse on diversity and pluralism in both countries until now? Which are focal points of discussion and where can similar or differing perspectives be described? Which implications can be derived for common educational work? What remains to be done in order to achieve the goals of networking, qualification and motivated action for diversity-conscious and democratic educational work?

We cordially invite interested partners, team leaders and youth workers of German-Israeli exchange programs and non-formal education to take part in this professional forum for networking and exchanging ideas – right in the middle of the year 2017!
