

**Protokoll
der Sitzung des Gemischten Fachausschusses
für den deutsch-israelischen Jugendaustausch
vom 10.-12. Dezember 2013 in Berlin**

1. Die jährliche Sitzung des Gemischten Fachausschusses für den deutsch-israelischen Jugendaustausch (im weiteren Fachausschuss genannt) fand unter dem Vorsitz von Thomas Thomer für das Bundesministerium für Familie, Senioren, Frauen und Jugend und Haim Cohen für die Israel Youth Exchange Authority in Berlin statt. Die Sitzung war von einer sehr konstruktiven und freundschaftlichen Atmosphäre geprägt. Die Zusammensetzung der Delegationen ergibt sich aus Anlage 1.
2. Der Fachausschuss nahm die Berichte über die jugendpolitischen Entwicklungen in beiden Ländern zur Kenntnis. Ein Schwerpunkt der Diskussion waren Fragen zur Integration junger Menschen mit Zuwanderungsgeschichte in beiden Ländern.
3. Der Fachausschuss zog eine positive Bilanz der Zusammenarbeit der Koordinierungsbüros. Er wertete die erreichten Ergebnisse als einen weiteren Beitrag zur Entwicklung des außerschulischen Jugendaustausches und würdigte die Leistung von ConAct und Israel Youth Exchange Authority im Jahr 2013.


Auch wenn vor dem Hintergrund der aktuell-politischen Situation im Nahen Osten nicht alle Vorhaben des deutsch-israelischen Jugendaustausches verwirklicht werden konnten, unterstrichen beide Seiten vor allem die Beständigkeit der Partnerschaften.

4. Der Fachausschuss begrüßte das große Engagement der Akteure des Austausches in beiden Ländern, das durch die Zahl beantragter Begegnungsprogramme für das Jahr 2014 zum Ausdruck kommt und die positive Entwicklung fortsetzt. Unter Berücksichtigung der qualitativen Anforderungen an bilaterale deutsch-israelische Austauschprogramme empfahl er, rund 350 Programme für den Jugendaustausch 2014 in die Förderung aufzunehmen.
5. Der Fachausschuss erörterte die gemeinsamen Vorhaben von ConAct und Israel Youth Exchange Authority zur Weiterentwicklung des deutsch-israelischen Jugendaustausches im Jahr 2014. Der Fachausschuss bat ConAct und die Israel Youth Exchange Authority, die in Anlage 2 aufgeführten Programme gemeinsam durchzuführen.

6. Der Fachausschuss bat ConAct und Israel Youth Exchange Authority, die in der Sitzung formulierten Überlegungen zur Gestaltung des 50. Jahrestages der Aufnahme diplomatischer Beziehungen im Jahr 2015 gemeinsam in eine Konzeption zu bringen. Der Schwerpunkt soll dabei auf der Durchführung von besonderen Veranstaltungen zum deutsch-israelischen Jugendaustausch in beiden Ländern liegen. Der Fachausschuss beschloss, zur Entwicklung und Begleitung der Vorhaben eine bilaterale Arbeitsgruppe einzusetzen, die im Januar 2014 ihre Arbeit aufnimmt.
7. Der Fachausschuss betonte die Notwendigkeit, nicht darin nachzulassen, Extremismus, Rassismus, Fremdenfeindlichkeit und Antisemitismus aktiv zu bekämpfen. Die wegweisenden Aktivitäten, die im Jugendaustausch zwischen beiden Ländern über Jahrzehnte bestehen, leisten hier einen wichtigen Beitrag.
8. Beide Seiten verständigten sich darauf, die nächste Sitzung des Gemischten Fachausschusses in der Zeit vom 2. bis 5. Dezember 2014 in Israel durchzuführen.



1. New Con-T-Acts – Match-Making

Seminar to build up new partnerships for German-Israeli exchange programs

The seminar aims at founding new and lasting partnerships within the field of German-Israeli youth contacts. It is open for all interested partners in the field of youth work who wish to establish a bilateral exchange program either for young people or for professionals in youth work from both countries.

In order to achieve the goal of founding new and lasting partnerships, interested partners from both countries are being matched beforehand. During two parts of an eleven-days seminar, taking place both in Germany and Israel, they get to know the frame of German-Israeli exchange programs and are supported with materials and knowledge in order to be able to start planning a project. The seminar offers the chance to get to know one another and to visit the partner organisation in the other country.

The first part of the Match-Making-Program will take place in March 2014 in Israel, the second part will take place in May 2014 in Germany.

2. *Facing Changes in the present of the past –*
Commemorating the Shoah in German-Israeli Youth Exchange
German-Israeli Conference

Encounters of German and Israeli youngsters focus on many aspects of the present life in both countries - on shared cultural experiences, common interests in social media and connecting challenges of a personal orientation in a globalized world. Yet the presence of the past - the persecution and murder of millions of Jews and other minorities by Germans all over Europe 70 years ago – is vibrant and often influencing perspectives on one another. Facing this history and finding ways of commemorating together poses one of the great educational challenges of German-Israeli youth encounters and at the same time brings about close personal and intergroup relations.

The enlarged variety of possibly participating youth from both countries poses new challenges for a fruitful educational process throughout German-Israeli encounters: How can we open up the specific context of German-Israeli relations, in which explicitly relating to the German-Jewish-Israeli past and presence is an integral part, for youngsters from differing cultural, religious and ethnic backgrounds? How can we keep on establishing a shared and meaningful commemoration of the Shoah, offering young people of today to connect to this history in individual ways? How can we encourage youngsters to draw conclusions from the past, create awareness and become active against discrimination and racism, for tolerance and equal human rights – beyond national borders?

The conference is meant to deepen the exchange of theory and practical experience regarding the educational challenges of commemorating the Shoah together and empowering young people for a respectful and democratic life today. Related to this discussion the enhanced and renewed handbook 'Commemorating Together – Building Bridges' will be presented.

The conference is a cooperative project of ConAct, The Bavarian Youth Council, the Municipality of Jerusalem and the Israel Youth Exchange Authority.

3. German-Israeli Junior-Team - ***Consolidating & enhancing the youth network***

Every now and again we look out for young people, who are knowledgeable and interested in supporting German-Israeli youth exchange – may it be for contributing to the preparation of a youth group visiting the other country, may it be for supporting public relation activities or may it be for supporting certain seminar projects of ConAct or the Israel Youth Council.

In 2014 we wish to continue the idea to build up a Junior team for German-Israeli Youth exchange: In a next bilateral meeting we wish to bring together an enhanced circle of young people who have already had personal experiences within the field of German-Israeli youth contacts, either through the participation in exchange projects, volunteer services or other ways of getting acquainted with the other country in a deep sense. Our aim is to prepare the events honouring the 50th anniversary of German-Israeli diplomatic relations, where the youth contacts will appear with visible projects and where we will have to count on young experienced people from both countries to support the planned projects.

4. Kom-Mit-Nadev – ***German-Israeli Volunteer-Program for young Israelis in Germany***

The German-Israeli Volunteer program Kom-Mit-Nadev is working in its fourth year. 55 Israeli volunteers have so far fulfilled a volunteer service in Germany since 2010, about 15-20 cooperative partnerships between German and Israeli organizations have been established in order to send and host these volunteers in Germany according to a set of conditions and educational goals which have been generated in an intensive bilateral working process.

During the last year Kom-Mit-Nadev has already changed its frame work in order to give and ask more independence of the involved organizations. The number of educational seminars offered by Kom-Mit-Nadev has been reduced to a reasonable number, at the same time also here giving back more responsibility to the hosting organizations.

For 2014 it is planned to hold the bilateral frame of the program with networking seminars and educational offers for the volunteers in cooperation with the participating organizations. This field of work will be taken care of by ConAct and the National Volunteer Association, in the name of the Israel Youth Exchange Authority.

5. Preparing the 50 anniversary of German-Israeli diplomatic relations – 2015

In May 2015 the beginning of diplomatic relations between Israel and Germany 50 years ago will be celebrated in various contexts of the existing bilateral relations and in the public of both countries. The youth contacts were among the first to build up these relations through personal encounters and through the emerging network of partnerships between German and Israeli youth organizations – starting some 10 years before the diplomatic relations.

The year 2014 will be used to prepare a number of projects, which will reveal the contribution of youth exchange for the existing strong and close relations between the two states and their inhabitants. The concrete projects to honor the 50 years of diplomatic relations and 60 years of youth contacts will need further bilateral planning, including work meetings and the establishment of a bilateral working group to set up the concrete operational setting of projects.

ConAct and the Israel Youth Exchange Authority will follow to set up the communicative and factual planning process for shared projects in Germany and Israel in 2015.
