


**Protokoll
der Sitzung des Gemischten Fachausschusses
für den deutsch-israelischen Jugendaustausch
vom 2. bis 5. Dezember 2014 in Jerusalem**

1. Die jährliche Sitzung des Gemischten Fachausschusses für den deutsch-israelischen Jugendaustausch (im weiteren Fachausschuss genannt) fand unter dem Vorsitz von Haim Cohen für die Israel Youth Exchange Authority (im weiteren IYEA genannt) und Thomas Thomer für das Bundesministerium für Familie, Senioren, Frauen und Jugend in Jerusalem statt. Die Sitzung war von einer konstruktiven und freundschaftlichen Atmosphäre geprägt. Die Zusammensetzung der Delegationen ergibt sich aus Anlage 1.
2. Der Fachausschuss nahm die Berichte über die jugendpolitischen Entwicklungen in beiden Ländern zur Kenntnis.
3. Der Fachausschuss wertete die erreichten Ergebnisse des Austausches im Jahr 2014 als einen weiteren Beitrag zur Entwicklung des außerschulischen Jugendaustausches und dankte ConAct und IYEA für das unverminderte Engagement bei der Weiterentwicklung des deutsch-israelischen Jugendaustausches.
4. Vor dem Hintergrund der aktuell-politischen Situation im Nahen Osten konnten auch im Jahr 2014 nicht alle Austauschvorhaben verwirklicht werden. Der Fachausschuss würdigte insbesondere die Beständigkeit der Partnerschaften und das damit einhergehende Engagement der Akteure des deutsch-israelischen Jugendaustausches.
5. Der Fachausschuss wertete die gleichbleibend hohe Anzahl von Anträgen auf Förderung von Begegnungsmaßnahmen als ein deutliches Zeichen des anhaltenden Interesses junger Menschen in beiden Ländern an Möglichkeiten von Begegnungen und Austausch. Er empfahl, unter Berücksichtigung der qualitativen Anforderungen an bilaterale deutsch-israelische Austauschprogramme rund 320 Programme für den Jugendaustausch 2015 in die Förderung aufzunehmen.
6. Der Fachausschuss erörterte die gemeinsamen Vorhaben von ConAct und IYEA zur Weiterentwicklung des deutsch-israelischen Jugendaustausches im Jahr 2015. Der Fachausschuss bat ConAct und IYEA, die in Anlage 2 aufgeführten Programme gemeinsam durchzuführen.

7. ConAct und IYEA berichteten über den Stand der Vorbereitungen der gemeinsamen Projekte zur Gestaltung des 50. Jahrestages der Aufnahme diplomatischer Beziehungen im Jahr 2015. Geplant ist die Durchführung eines Deutsch-Israelischen Jugendkongresses in der Zeit vom 4. bis 11. Mai 2015 in Israel und in Berlin mit 300 Jugendlichen aus beiden Ländern. Der Fachausschuss dankte der bilateralen Arbeitsgruppe für die geleistete Arbeit und rief die Träger im Jugendaustausch dazu auf, das Jubiläum inhaltlich aufzugreifen.
8. Der Fachausschuss empfahl den Akteuren des Austausches, in ihren Begegnungsmaßnahmen im Jahr 2015 den 70. Jahrestag der Befreiung des Konzentrationslagers Auschwitz und den 70. Jahrestag des Endes des Zweiten Weltkrieges in geeigneter Weise zu würdigen.
9. Der Fachausschuss betonte die Notwendigkeit, auch weiterhin nicht darin nachzulassen, Extremismus, Rassismus, Fremdenfeindlichkeit und Antisemitismus aktiv zu bekämpfen. Die wegweisenden Aktivitäten, die im Jugendaustausch zwischen beiden Ländern über Jahrzehnte bestehen, leisten hier einen wichtigen Beitrag.
10. Beide Seiten verständigten sich darauf, die nächste Sitzung des Gemischten Fachausschusses vom 30. November bis 3. Dezember 2015 in Köln durchzuführen.



1. German-Israeli Youth Congress

50 Years of Israeli-German Diplomatic Relations – 60 years of Youth Exchange

German-Israeli Youth Encounters have paved the way for diplomatic relations between both countries. Youth exchange programs have contributed to the establishment of a dense network of cooperations in youthwork, educational and cultural cooperations, which today form a core part of Israeli-German relations.

In order to celebrate this long and lasting network the Israel Youth Exchange Authority and ConAct will invite 300 young former and continuously engaged participants of exchange projects to participate in an 8-day youth congress taking place both in Israel and Germany. The young people will bring in their experience, interests and questions in order to discuss the past, present and future of Israeli-German (Youth) Relations. The main topics will be 'creating and shaping society', 'understanding diverse life realities' and 'living with history'. At the end of inspiring encounters and intensive discussions the young people will present the outcome of their working process and hand it over to political leaders of both countries.

2. Spotlight – on... 50 Years of German-Israeli Relations

A youth-expedition through the past, present and future of diverse relations

Within this encounter program a bilateral youth delegation will be sent out to both countries, with the aim of portraying the relations between Germany and Israel. Within a total time frame of two weeks this youth delegation will explore historical, political and personal stories of German-Israeli youth encounters. The delegation participants will meet pioneers of German-Israeli youth relations as well as young

activists engaged in this field today and thereby conceptualize, develop and implement ideas on how to portrait German-Israeli relations.

Professionals out of the field of media pedagogy will guide the youths during this process. During the first seven days of the project the youths will stay in Israel, the second half of the project will take place in Germany. As an overall goal of this exchange project the youths should develop a cinematic exhibition, providing insights into a youth-perspective onto the German-Israeli relations. The results of the project are to be exhibited as part of the official celebrations between Germany and Israel in May 2015.

3. Exchange-Visions – 60 years of German-Israeli Youth Exchange

The existing bilateral website showing the history and projects of German-Israeli Youth Exchange throughout centuries will be renewed: the research on historical facts, figures and stories is being deepened, the technical performance is being renewed and the range of presented projects of German-Israeli youth and professional exchanges will be enhanced. The new website will function both as a data base and a living archive showing experience, incidents, organisations and political developments connected to the field of youth contacts between Germany and Israel.

The website is fully functioning in Hebrew and German, organisations from both countries will be invited to include their data and pictures onto the website.

The new website will go online with the beginning on 2015. The concept and historical milestones in German-Israeli Youth Relations will be presented on a poster-exhibition at the Youth Congress 2015.

4. Moving Moments Connecting for Life...

Scientific research and professional insights into German-Israeli Youth Exchange - Book-project honoring 60 years of personal and professional experience

Bringing the young generations together was one of the answers to cope with the history of German-Jewish relations. During the last 60 years more than 600.000

youngsters participated in organized frames of youth exchange, school exchange and volunteer services. They met without and within frames which were created in order to allow them to get to know one another, in order to spend leisure time or have meaningful discussions, in order to represent a better future or to be just themselves.

Which were expectations, aims and concepts of German-Israeli Youth Exchange over the time? What experiences can responsible representatives of lasting cooperative projects in Israel and Germany report? Which dynamics have been observed and reflected upon throughout encounters of young people, given the heavy burden of the past and challenging living conditions in the present? How have encounters of young Germans and Israelis contributed to the political and societal relations between both countries over decades? What are expectations, visions, challenges, and hopes for the future of German-Israeli youth relations?

These and more questions will be dealt with in contributed articles for this book-project. The collection in the book shall include mainly scientific publications about research being done in the field. The book shall be presented on the German-Israeli Youth Congress in May 2015, including lectures and talks with the authors on the published issues.

5. New Con-T-Acts – Match-Making

Seminar to build up new partnerships for German-Israeli exchange programs

The seminar aims at founding new and lasting partnerships within the field of German-Israeli youth contacts. It is open for all interested partners in the field of youth work who wish to establish a bilateral exchange program either for young people or for professionals in youth work from both countries.

In order to achieve the goal of founding new and lasting partnerships, interested partners from both countries are being matched beforehand. During two parts of an eleven-days seminar, taking place both in Germany and Israel, they get to know the frame of German-Israeli exchange programs and are supported with materials and knowledge in order to be able to start planning a project. The seminar offers the chance to get to know one another and to visit the partner organisation in the other country.

The first part of the Match-Making-Program will take place in autumn 2015 in Israel, the second part will take place in spring 2016 in Germany.

6. Kom-Mit-Nadev –

German-Israeli Volunteer-Program for young Israelis in Germany

The German-Israeli Volunteer program Kom-Mit-Nadev is working in its fifth year. About 70 Israeli volunteers have so far fulfilled a volunteer service in Germany since 2010, about 15-20 cooperative partnerships between German and Israeli organizations have been established in order to send and host these volunteers in Germany according to a set of conditions and educational goals which have been generated in an intensive bilateral working process.

During the last years Kom-Mit-Nadev has changed its frame work in order to give and ask more independence of the involved organizations. The number of educational seminars offered by Kom-Mit-Nadev has been reduced to a reasonable number, at the same time also here giving back more responsibility to the hosting organizations.

For 2015 it is planned to hold the bilateral frame of the program with networking seminars and educational offers for the volunteers in cooperation with the participating organizations.
